

The Liberty Station NTC Sub-Committee met on Wednesday, February 20, 2013 at 1:30 PM in the Point Loma Library.

Board members in attendance included: Dominic Carnevale, Chair; Jarvis Ross and Patricia Clark, Secretary.

Community attendance included: Toni Crockett

Discussion began concerning the CUP (Conditional Use Permit) for Liberty Station. Jarvis will contact Donna Frye, who now works for Mayor Filner's office, concerning the history and validity of the existing CUP.

Toni Crockett was interested in the progress of the swimming complex in the Liberty Station Park. The committee was not able to offer any new information but will continue to seek any updates.

Parking issues for The Rock Church continue to be a problem. Questions arise concerning the original Precise Plan requirement of 56 off street parking spaces for the church. The discussion was tabled for now.

Concern for the USS Recruit: The PCPB NTC sub-committee will communicate with Mike Ryan, the PCPB Parks and Rec. Sub-Committee Chair, to ask whether he can assist with finding those who could help in the refurbishment of the "Recruit". Perhaps Bruce Coons, from SOHO, could help us with the restoration. Jarvis, a member of SOHO, will speak with Bruce.

McMillin did not respond to the letter written by the PCPB NTC sub-committee/PCPB concerning the upkeep of Building 271 (Fit For Life). There is conversation that HTH will acquire said building.

Dominic read the letter, written for the community to sign, asking McMillin to maintain Bldg. 271.
